From the CEO

You probably noticed there was not a January issue of this newsletter. We did not miss getting it out. It was critical for everyone involved in producing the newsletter to have a chance for some down time at the end of our



record-setting 2024. We are all excited to share that information with you here and in the upcoming annual report.

We will continue our 20th anniversary celebration into May when we officially turn 21. There were several important milestones achieved during 2024 and I appreciate everyone who helped make these achievements possible. Thank you! Here are just a few:

Most Missions

We set a goal of 100 missions for 2024. We wrapped up the year with 126. The number of missions is the product of networking and building trust with agencies and partners since we never self-deploy. TEXSAR's reputation continues to open doors thanks to the commitment, professionalism and selflessness of our volunteers.

Most Deployable Members

We finished the year with the most deployable members in our history. TEXSAR members are not deployable until they have completed minimum required training that takes about six months for most newcomers. Thanks to our growing volunteer base we are able to bring more people and skills in service to Texas.

New Counties Served

TEXSAR volunteers were called upon in 13 counties that we had never before served. That bring the total number of Texas counties that TEXSAR has served to 104.

Most Funds Raised in a Year

It takes money to accomplish the many things that TEXSAR has achieved. Equipment, supplies, maintenance, fuel...a long list of expenses accompany our efforts. In 2024, TEXSAR secured more funding than ever before thanks to contributions, grants and sponsorships.

BeforeDuringAfter

After three years of collaboration with Texas State University and Texas Mutual Insurance, TEXSAR launched BeforeDuringAfter, a resource to help small businesses prepare for and recover from disasters. In December, we hired Justen Noakes to serve as the Executive Director of the initiative. This resource is already catching the attention of small businesses across the state.

There is actually more to share, and it will be in our annual report. 2024 was truly a great year, but **it does not** mark a goal achieved. It marks a waypoint on a quest as TEXSAR continues to provide service above self as "Texans helping Texans." <u>TEXSAR never stops.</u>

Development Corner

How can you donate more money to a nonprofit over time, lower your tax exposure and end up giving more than you had to begin with? (This article presents ideas to explore with your financial advisor and does not constitute financial, legal or tax advice.)

The answer: Put the funds into something that grows in value. That sounds simple enough for personal gain, but it also works with your philanthropic plans.

Money invested in publicly traded stock that grows in value provides a great opportunity to donate the appreciated stock directly to a nonprofit which enables you to avoid capital gains tax. Of course, TEXSAR welcomes such donations!

Another, longer-term approach, is to purchase a life insurance policy with your chosen nonprofit selected as a beneficiary. There are additional ways that policies can be used for your benefit and the benefit of your chosen charity(ies). This <u>article</u> provides a good start before talking with your advisor(s).

Partner Perspective



From personal tragedy can come positive change. Chris Branham's family describes how the foundation in his honor came to be and why.

On June 24, 2020, 26-year-old Christopher Branham was reported missing by his family. Within days, the Round Rock, TX police department determined that Chris had become the victim of an armed robbery and had been killed. They also knew who had committed the crimes. However, Chris was still missing and the suspects were not cooperating, so after forensic investigations into the possible location of the murder, the police involved TEXSAR. On July 3, 2020 the first major search took place. The family was present and very thankful, and shared they were impressed by the size of the operation and the fact that the volunteers had traveled from all over to look for Christopher, on a holiday weekend at the height of the Pandemic. The volunteers were in uniform and gathered around a command vehicle to get instructions for the day before setting out with their dogs. The Branhams had brought a photo of Christopher to show the searchers whom they were looking for. In 100-degree heat, the volunteers searched many cornfields, shrubs, and snake-infested overgrown ditches, and even stayed longer than originally planned. Though Christopher wasn't found that first day, the family was hopeful their son would be found soon. They had to cling to that hope a bit longer as for the next four weeks, they saw additional ground searches, watched helicopters and planes go up, and saw boats in the water. On July 31, 2020, Christopher's body was ultimately found by a farmer in a cornfield near the original search area. Within days, the police then captured and arrested the criminals and charged them with Capital Murder.

In 2021, Christopher's family, together with close friends, established the Chris Branham Foundation as part of the Central Texas Community Foundation.



They are an all-volunteer nonprofit in support of causes that were important to Chris. While also attending the many individual court hearings for the 5 criminals involved in Christopher's death in 2021 and 2022, their volunteer work quickly became a positive and welcome distraction, and a labor of love. The Foundation focuses on awarding grants to Search and Rescue/Recovery organizations to support searches for missing persons, trade school scholarships for local high school graduates, and youth sports scholarships. Growing up, Chris was an avid baseball and football player and continued to play golf and softball as an adult. He also attended a trade school and was a small business owner and young father. To celebrate Christopher's life, the Foundation organizes golf tournaments as fundraisers in his memory, as well as Christmas Bingo and corn hole tournaments.
