## From the CEO



Each year we are called to serve in counties that we have not served in before. Over the course of our history, we have now served in 104 counties. Texas has 254 counties and our aspiration is to have been called upon in 200 of them by the year 2028. We took an important step in that quest with a formal commitment to collaborate with the National Park Service to assist them with Preventative Search-and-Rescue as well as search and rescue. Our volunteers have been helping prepare visitors to the Guadalupe Mountains National Park with instructions and guidance at the trailheads, as well as being available if someone gets into trouble on the trails.

The NPS is not the first federal agency to partner with TEXSAR, nor will it likely be the last. Every mission that TEXSAR undertakes is in partnership with an agency or critical infrastructure partner because TEXSAR never self-deploys. And, of course, we never charge for TEXSAR services.

We are available statewide because of the commitment of our volunteers who give their time and talents to help those in need. **April 20-26 is National Volunteer Week**, a perfect time to thank all the volunteers who serve so many nonprofits and organizations to make the world a better place, one minute at a time. Thank you, TEXSAR volunteers...TEXSAR is what it is because of you.

#### **Thrivent Recognized**

#### Data Analysis...a key to cold cases

A lot of people think of "search-and-rescue" as jumping into raging waters to save someone, pulling up to a house during a flood to rescue someone, or tromping around fields and streams in search of someone. Well... yes, and no. Those are part of the process, but data analysis and other technology-based tools and assets are becoming key elements of TEXSAR's ability to respond to the needs of agencies. Agencies trust TEXSAR with critical information that enables us to analyze it as part of a true partnership and working relationship. In a recent case, after several missions to explore a field for the remains of a missing person, data analysis of key information led to the discovery of remains after only ten minutes of searching thanks to the new information.

#### **National Park Service Partnership**

The National Park Service recently formally recognized TEXSAR as a key resource to the Guadalupe Mountains National Park. TEXSAR volunteers will serve at trailheads, helping increase awareness and education of hikers before they head into the mountains, as well as providing rescue assistance when needed. In addition to the preventative services, TEXSAR members have assisted with a myriad of medical and rescue operations.

### 2024 Annual Report...what a year it was!

## North Texas Municipalities Endorse TEXSAR's BeforeDuringAfter for Business Disaster Preparedness

In Summer 2024, TEXSAR and its partners released BeforeDuringAfter (B4DA), a free resource that brings together important information in one place to help small businesses and their communities prepare for disasters. Response statewide has been exceptional.

Recently, Wise County and the City of Decatur officially partnered with B4DA, marking the first time a city and county have formally adopted the program as a platform for emergency information and resources. The milestone agreement establishes a precedent for other municipalities seeking to protect businesses and sustain economic growth in challenging times.

The B4DA coalition is eager to partner with other Economic Development Corporations (EDCs) seeking an accessible, turnkey approach to disaster response.

Highlights of the Partnership:

- Boosts Business Preparedness: Local businesses now have access to a centralized resource for disaster planning, checklists and emergency contacts.
- Improves Outreach: B4DA will enhance its educational outreach through engaging events such as Lunch & Learns, community business fairs and feedback initiatives.
- Establishes Model for Success: The partnership with Wise County and Decatur creates a framework for working with other municipalities looking to boost emergency awareness and disaster preparedness.

Before During After is a public-private partnership developed by Texas Mutual Insurance Company, TEXSAR, Texas State Institute for Government Innovation, Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas, OneStar Foundation and Texas Chamber of Commerce Executives, with funding support from Wells Fargo.



# **Partner Perspective**

TEXSAR's efforts touch lives across the state...and beyond.

John O'Keefe is involved with El Dorado County Search and Rescue in California (EDSAR). He recently shared his perspectives on ADIAT (<u>Automated Drone Image Analysis Tool</u>), the open-source software tool developed by TEXSAR to help maximize efficiency and effectiveness of analyzing images captured by drones in search/recovery/rescue missions. EDSAR works at the direction of the El Dorado County Sheriff's Office. John said that he believes they appreciate how ADIAT can help identify colors and objects in drone images, and that other organizations are also becoming more interested in ADIAT as it is used in more mutual aid missions.



John joined EDSAR about a year ago. "I am drawn to SAR because I love helping people. I have had CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) experience and was involved in a ham radio club. My profession is developing video games and with the drones I have been able to blend my familiarity with technology with my desire to help people."

When he first joined the drone team, he encountered other software programs that analyze images. "I heard about ADIAT and checked it out because the other packages are expensive. I tried ADIAT and found it to be as capable as anything out there, more user friendly and free. I enjoyed using it. EDSAR got called

into a mutual aid mission and I used ADIAT. It performed great and I thought of other features that might be helpful, so I contacted Charlie to see if he was open to suggestions. He agreed. He is great to work with. He exemplifies what is common among SAR people...big heart."

"Charlie" is Charlie Grove, the long-time TEXSAR volunteer who developed ADIAT. He was recognized in January 2025 with TEXSAR's Distinguished Service Award. Charlie recognizes John as a great champion of ADIAT as well as great partner who contributed to the codebase of the latest release of ADIAT.

John's impressions of "SAR people" are common among those in the profession. "They are the best bunch of people I have ever been around," he said. When it comes to caring for others and the commitment to serve, there are no boundaries. ADIAT helps TEXSAR serve well beyond Texas' 254 counties.


# **Gallery of the Month**
